

German Doctors In Open Rebellion Over Swine Flu Jab

Accuse Government Of Lying

17 October 2009: Leading German doctors are in open rebellion over the "swine flu" jab, according to a leading German magazine "Spiegel."

The President of the German Society for General Practitioners and Family Medicine, Michael Kochen, has told GPs not to give patients the "swine flu" jab. The President of the Association for Doctors for Children and Young People, Professor Wolfram Hartmann accused the government of making "false scientific claims."

"The risk of damage is greater than the benefit," Hartmann said. "The [swine flu] vaccine has not been tested at all on them (pregnant women and children), and that is why the risk of mindlessly using this vaccine is just too big," he said. He said that children had immune systems that tended to overreact and just such an overreaction could be triggered by the adjuvants. In addition, he criticized the use of mercury as a preservative.

"That stuff has been deliberately left out of today's vaccines," said Hartmann. The mounting protests have resulted in orders by the states for new "swine flu" vaccines without mercury and adjuvants that will be available from the mid to end of November, according to the "Spiegel." The German Health Minister Ulla Schmidt is insisting that the "swine flu" jabs with adjuvants are safe but the Germans are no longer listening.

Poll: 75% Of Finns Don't Want The Swine Flu Vaccine

In Finland, at least three somewhat big media outlets, Ilta-Sanomat, MTV3 and Helsingin Sanomat, have held polls asking the Finnish people if they are going to take the swine flu vaccine. The results are as follows.

1) The first online poll was held by MTV3. It's unclear how many people took part in it, but 61% said they do not want the swine flu vaccine.

2) Nearly 12,000 people answered the Helsingin Sanomat Gallup, and the overwhelming majority, 75%, answered "No."

3) Then a third poll at the end of September held by Ilta-Sanomat rendered the exact same percentage as the Helsingin Sanomat Gallup, 75% will not be taking the vaccine. Over 16,000 people took part in the Ilta-Sanomat poll.

So it seems that, in spite of intense government and mainstream media propaganda and fear mongering on the swine flu, the Finnish people have not bought the hype.
